



#### AA Badenhorst Secateurs Red 2010

We are sticking our neck out again this week. We reckon the Secateurs Red 2010 is THE best South African red wine under R100. Mostly shiraz sourced from around the Swartland, it's not only fleshy and flavoursome, but it holds a brightness and lift one expects from cooler, more European climes. Adi has hit a complete home run here, and Neal Martin's latest **Wine Advocate** review is in agreement. The 90/100 rating is in line with many wines 3 or 4 times its price! Buy this wine by the case-load, it is delicious.

*A blend of 74% Shiraz, 10% Cinsault plus Grenache, Carignan and Mourvedre aged for 14 months in old French casks, the entry-level 2010 Secateurs Red Blend has ripe raspberry, blackberry and wild hedgerow on the nose that is well defined and very natural. The palate is medium-bodied, supple on the entry with juicy bright red berries, raspberry, red currant and has a touch of citrus peel lending freshness and vitality. Drink now-2013 - 90/100 Neal Martin, Robert Parkers Wine Advocate*

The Secateurs Chenin Blanc is similarly as good and the 2010 received 89/100 in the same review but unfortunately has just sold out. The 2011 continues in the same vein; bright Mediterranean styled fruit with a fabulous texture and zippy finish. Phenomenal value! Here are a few other wines under R100 that are all made in a Southern French style and deliver brilliant **bang for buck!**
